

# Annual Report 2012

## ECREA International & Intercultural Communication Section

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The ECREA International and Intercultural Section (IIC) has been active since early 2006. The Section has today 258 members.

### **Membership**

The section has consolidated its membership with 258 members today subscribed.

### **Organization of events/Management of the IIC Section**

The section, in cooperation with 2 other sections of ECREA (Law and Policy and Journalism Studies Sections), has organized and managed the conference "*The European Public Sphere – From critical thinking to responsible action*" which took place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of February 2012 at the Committee of the Regions in Brussels. More than 200 people subscribed and participated to the event and many EU institutions civil servants also contributed.

The preparation for the conference started in early 2011 with the call for papers distributed in may 2011.

On the 15<sup>th</sup> of February 2011 the section Chair introduced a proposal for a Jean Monnet Conference to support the event and in July 2011 the proposal got a positive feedback from the European Commission.

The conference has been a jointly ECREA-SMIT/VUB event and was held at the Committee of the Regions in Brussels. The Committee of the Regions has accepted in an early stage to contribute to the events with rooms and logistics.

This has been the first time that an ECREA event is hold in a European Institution. It has been also the first time that an ECREA event has received the support of the European LifeLong Learning programme.

The [Jean Monnet](#) conference "The European Public Sphere: from critical thinking to responsible action" has been a one day conference with [three](#) parallel thematic sessions in the morning, [a](#) plenary session [and a Round Table](#) in the afternoon. The parallel sessions analysed and reflected upon the EPS from the perspectives of Identity Building and Citizenship Building, Communication and Information Strategies and Policies and Multiple Governance Structures and Actors. The plenary session [presented further reflections](#) on concrete policy [recommendations](#) and actions to implement the EPS and empower citizens [in view of the discussions at the parallel sessions in the morning. A concluding Round Table discussed on the public sphere\(s\) and space\(s\) in Europe.](#)

The innovative character of the conference is due not only to the fact that practitioners, policy makers and academics contributed to the event, but and especially to the fact that the topic of the European Public Sphere has been regarded from the point of view of identity and citizenship building and multilevel governance structures and actors.

In October 2012 the Book titled after the conference was published with Peter Lang.<sup>1</sup>

### **ICC@ECC12**

For the ECC12, the IIC section accepted about 60% of the submitted abstracts for presentation at the conference. Eight sessions were organized, with an average of 4 presentations in each session. Moreover, 5 poster presentations were accepted.

Overall the sessions were very interesting and lively, but the section also had to deal with quite a few no-shows. The majority of the people who didn't show up did not notify the section program chair of their absence.

### **Election of New Steering committee**

During the Business meeting on the Thursday the 25<sup>th</sup> of October at the ECREA 2012 conference, a new steering committee was elected to replace the former one.

Prof. Dr.. Teresa Velazques, Departament of Journalims and Communication Sciences, Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona was elected as Chair at unanimity (7/7votes)

Daniele Canedo, PhD candidate, VUB, iMinds/SMIT & Stijn Joye, PhD, Ghent University, Communication Studies Department, were elected at unanimity (7/7votes) as Vice-Chairs.

### **Section Event 2013**

The IIC-section plans a one- or two-day workshop on 6 and/or 7 November 2013 at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB), in the Faculty of Communication Sciences. The workshop will be primarily aimed at PhD students and early-career scholars. The new management team is proposing the theme of 'Global communication: social change and media flows' for the workshop which should attract a broad and international audience of scholars. Possible cooperation with other ECREA sections, TWG and networks will be investigated as well as sponsorship by academic publishers who publish journals that address the specific topic of the workshop. Depending on the financial resources, the team will look into inviting one or two keynote speakers.
