# ECREA TWG: Children, Youth and Media

### About the TWG

The ECREA TWG: Children, Youth and Media was proposed in February 2012, and approved by ECREA in May 2012. The management team for the year 2018 was elected by members in April 2017, and consists of Prof. Elisabeth Staksrud, University of Oslo (Chair), and Vice Chairs Prof. David Smahel, Masaryk University (re-elected) and Ass. Prof. Bieke Zaman, KU Leuven.

As of January 2019, the group consists of 201 registered members, an increase of 74 members in one year.

In addition, the group communicates with 188 interested scholars from over 30 countries subscribing to our list-serv newsletter.

The rationale for the activities facilitated by the current management team includes:

- Establish a relevant group of experts with whom to have in-depth discussions
- Find way to address the demand from media/policy makers about our research topics
- · Mentoring for young scholars

## Activities and achievements to date

In 2018, ECREA TWG CYM management group continued to focusing on facilitating meeting places for its members and for other interested colleagues, finding ways to foster interactivity within and beyond the scholarly community, and make the group publicly visible.

In 2018, the management group has focused on the creation of various complementary online meeting places and communication channels, including but not limited to:

The group arranged a successful ECREA pre-conference before the ICA conference in Prague, May 2018. The pre-conference "Trust, Control, and Privacy: Mediatization of Childhood and Adolescence in the Digital Age" was arranged together with the ECREA section on Mediatization, in cooperation with the Institute for Communication at Charles University Prague. Main conference contact has been Christine Trueltzsch. A total of 34 proposals were submitted to the conference, of which 25 were selected. CYM is also cooperating with the Journal of Children and Media (JoCAM) to produce 1-2 special issues of the journal after the conference. <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> <u>Description of conference topic based on the call for papers:</u> Digital media is not just part of children's cultures but is inherently part of their everyday practices through which they explore and construct the world. Within this context, children develop a large range of literacy skills and practices related to education, consumption of media and cultural texts, lifestyle, sexuality. Young people use digital media for school work, communication, flirting, news consumption, political engagement, activism or for interaction with their favourite celebrities (on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter and other platforms). As such, digital media serve as a multipurpose platform of self-performance, identity construction and self-projection, enriching children's lived experiences and everyday culture. Considering such skills and practices as agentic claims to citizenship and claims to broader participation in different aspects of the public discourse, we invite contributions from researchers working within media studies, cultural studies, education, psychology and sociology, looking at how children develop or engage with literacy practices through the use of digital media and cultural consumption.
